CONFIRMATION, BALLOONS, & THE HOLY SPIRIT

A REPORT BY ANNE MILLARD

Around eighty children will be confirmed in our pastoral region over the next two weeks. We ask you to keep the children and their families in your prayers. These children received most of their training for the Sacraments of Initiation online. Using a platform called Moodle, the children and their families logged on each week to watch a short instructional video about aspects of the sacraments. They discussed the video as a family and were asked to post responses via a discussion forum.

The online platform ideally embodies the Diocesan directive that the Sacramental journey be family centred, parish based, and school supported. Almost all the videos are homemade featuring individuals from our Parishes. Although a bit cheesy, they have been well received and the children all seem to have learned from them.

The use of video for instruction ensures the learning is easily accessible for the whole family. Our school teachers have been incredibly supportive of the program. We are very blessed to have such wonderful schools in our Parish!

A major part of the children's preparation for Confirmation is the Works of Mercy project, whereby the children, with support from their families, devise and carry out either a Spiritual or Corporal Work of Mercy. The reports are beautiful. Our children are caring, thoughtful, and compassionate.

The final piece of the children's preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation is attending a full day retreat at The Cathedral. A number of parishioners volunteered their time to provide the students with hands-on experiences to learn about our faith and our church.

The final part of the retreat day involved each child being given a balloon. Balloons often indicate celebrations—we usually see them at parties. The balloon is red—the colour of Pentecost. It's no accident that Confirmation takes place during the same week as Pentecost. We think of Pentecost as the birthday of the church. Another good reason for a balloon!

You can have a lot of fun with a balloon. But there is something lacking in balloons. They needed to be filled with air—before a balloon can fulfill its purpose, someone must breathe some life into it!

I think a balloon provides a perfect metaphor to help us understand the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is the day that God sent the Holy Spirit to breathe life into the church so it would be all that God intended for it to be.

At the Last Supper, Jesus told his disciples that he would not be with them much longer and promised to send the Holy Spirit to help them. We hear about the arrival of the Holy Spirit in the Acts of the Apostles:

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

Before God sent His Holy Spirit, the church was lifeless --like the balloons the children received. After the Holy Spirit breathed life into the church, people began telling everyone they saw about Jesus. The church as we know it was born! The story of Jesus spread from that day throughout the whole world.

At the retreat, we encouraged the children to breathe life into their balloons and to remember that just as the balloon needs to be filled to become what it was intended to be, we all need the Holy Spirit to fill us so we can be all that God wants us to be.

There's beautiful energy between children and balloons, but inevitably some broke—the Holy Spirit can be a violent wind. Sometimes the Holy Spirit is buoyant and makes our balloons fly high. Sometimes they pop. We can't control a balloon, just as we can't control the Holy Spirit. I hope the spirit soars in you this Pentecost.

NOTICE TO PLANNED GIVERS - THE END OF FINANCIAL YEAR IS COMING!

Planned Giving Tax Receipts: Parishioners who require a tax receipt for planned giving for the 2023/2024 financial year must notify the Parish Office **by Friday, 28 June 2024.**

Please submit requests in writing by one of the following methods:

Email to newcparish@mn.catholic.org.au: Use the wording, *"Please provide me with a Planned Giving tax receipt"* and include your name and envelope number.

Planned Giving Envelope: Write on your weekly envelope, *"Tax receipt required"*.

Tax receipt data will be processed immediately following 30 June 2024. If you make a request after that date you will not be eligible for a receipt, nor for a tax deduction in relation to your planned giving contributions. This is because there is a designated sum that can be attributed to planned giving receipts and, once this distribution has occurred, no further allocations are possible.

The 'designated sum' provision also means that the claimable amount for each giver decreases when more people request a receipt. We therefore request that if you do not intend to claim a tax deduction, please do not request a receipt.

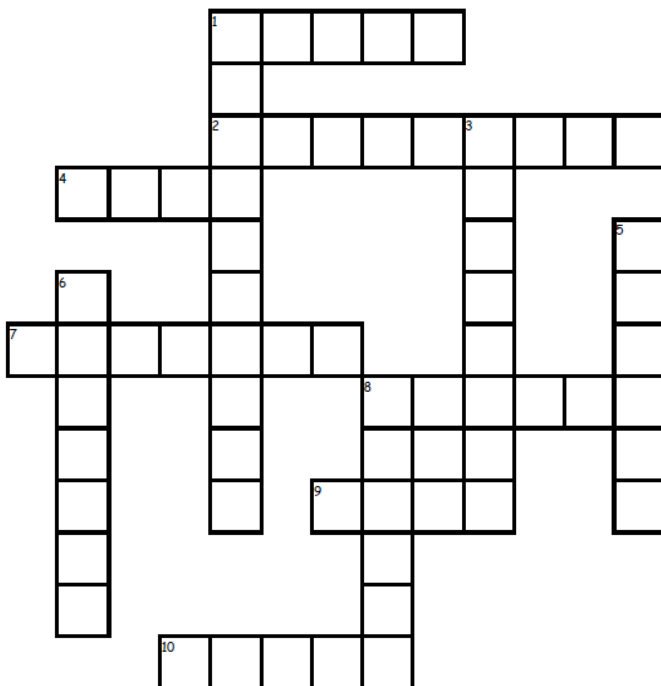

HISTORICAL CONTEXT

Pentecost

The word Pentecost comes from the Greek for fiftieth day. Pentecost Sunday ends the season of Easter and comes as a Sabbath day after seven weeks of seven days. In Jewish tradition the 50th day after the Passover was celebrated as a blessing of the harvest and rather than the unleavened bread of Passover it was celebrated by leavening the bread. It was for this reason that the disciples were gathered together when they experienced the Holy Spirit empowering them. In Christian tradition, Pentecost is celebrated as the arrival of the Spirit, promised by Jesus, that animated the disciples to spread the gospel of Jesus and gather believers to form what would eventually become the Church.

LIVING THE GOSPEL

Come, Holy Spirit

'Come, Holy Spirit', or its Latin, *Veni Sancte Spiritus*, has become the basis of countless prayers and hymns over many hundreds of years. To this day, it remains a powerful invocation that can be used in prayer or meditation. Three simple words convey a wealth of meaning. The invitation for the Spirit to 'Come' indicates recognition of the need for the Spirit's intervention and openness to accept the guidance that the Spirit brings.
