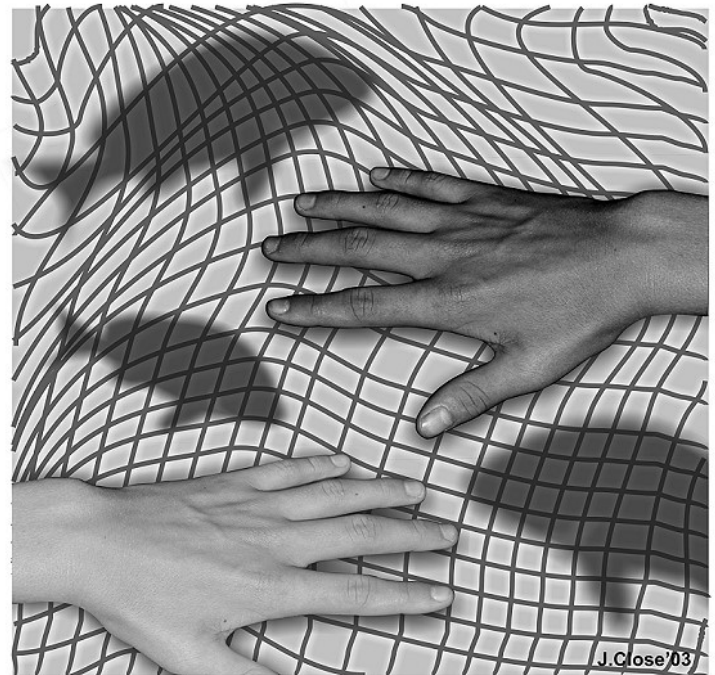

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

I was really pleased this week to celebrate the beginning of a new school year with Saint Francis Xavier College, Hamilton as the new year 7s and 11s began the journey with them, and of course us. It was a wonderful celebration of the Mass, and the young people were flawless in their engagement. I am not sure they were as amused by my reference to my military career and the ability I joyfully announced to dig trenches, run barb wire, and accurately shoot, or where those skills might be employed. I was excited that the school believed it was important to begin the year with the Eucharist. The music and the liturgy were simply put, lovely.



In my homily I reflected on the necessity for all of us to play our part no matter how small for the kingdom of God and the transformation of the world around us. I often say we should leave where we are the better for our having been there. That is not always simply being nice. Proper stewardship does sometimes mean that we engage the world by being in opposition to its values. I love it when Pope Francis says we '*sometimes*' do that by using '*words.*' Remember that Christians do good *things* only when there are opportunities for it: I must sometimes be the doer but sometimes too, to be the person who receives the good. When I am sick, hungry, or lonely I am invited in my Christian life to allow the visit, the food, and the company. We all have a part to play.

Thanks to all those who do for us and thanks too for all those times when you let someone do for you. Know it is noticed, appreciated, and very much needed.

There are **never enough** volunteers in my life or parish. I am so grateful for all those who put their hand up to help. Sometimes we are not called to what we think we are, that is why a conversation about the ministry is important. It is no good volunteering to read if you get so nervous you cannot speak; sometimes you must give it a go. You might however be called to a different ministry not the one you initially step forward for: think about it and then let us talk!!

You will notice that the Diocese is launching Jubilee 2025 'Pilgrims of Hope' on the 2 March. You might also notice that all the Sunday morning Masses that day (2 March) are cancelled. You are invited to be a pilgrim with a walk (if you are up to it) from Nobby's

(8.00am) to the Cathedral for Mass (10.00am) followed by a festival of fun activities and food. This Jubilee Year is the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord, an 'event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church'. Save the date and come along.

The Parish Bulletin will have other events for you to attend during the year. Look out for the calendar of events. The bishop is going to communicate with the Diocese to announce the Churches that will be designated pilgrimage sites. Stay tuned. During the Jubilee Year there will be opportunities to participate, volunteer, be active, for God's grace and his bountiful love. Seize the moments as they come.

NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR VOLUNTEERS

We have two exciting new opportunities for volunteers in the region.

1. Baptism Team
2. Sacramental Team

BAPTISM PREPARATION: The role of this team is to assist parents of infants to be baptised to understand their parental responsibilities and the liturgy of baptism. Team members will instruct parents on the meaning and significance of the Sacrament of Baptism and how important it is for parents to pass on the gift of faith to their children.



We anticipate meetings will take place monthly, likely on a Tuesday evening. The meeting will cover the format of the ceremony. The team members will then be encouraged to attend the baptismal ceremony.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION: The role of this team is working with children and their parents to prepare for first reconciliation, confirmation and first communion. Over the past years (beginning during COVID), the sacramental program has been fully online. This year we are returning to small group meetings to prepare the children for the sacraments. The program is fully documented and easy to follow.

SEASONS FOR GROWTH

No season lasts forever, not even winter.

Our lives, like the seasons, are constantly changing. These changes often involve many losses and deep grief. Learning how to recognise and adapt to the stressful events and changed circumstances we experience, as well as the ongoing challenges these may bring, helps to bring peace and hope into our lives.

The Seasons for Growth small group, peer-based educational program offers the opportunity for individual reflection and group discussion by gently and symbolically using the metaphor of the seasons to support adults to:

- **Learn** about how different people respond to change, loss and grief
- **Understand** that it is normal to experience a range of grief reactions
- **Explore** new approaches to dealing with change, loss and grief in their lives
- **Build** communication, decision making and problem solving skills
- **Participate** in a supportive network of peers and adults
- **Integrate** their new learning into their relationships with family, friends and others.

Please consider joining this supportive space in 2025 if you would like to share conversation and learn together with others who are also navigating the different seasons of life and loss.

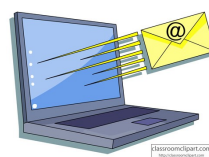
LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS

The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish. To this end, your attention is drawn to the **threat of online grooming**.

Many children received phones as a Christmas present, often with the intention of providing families with convenient contact while children are out of house: for children 6-13 years in Australia, nearly half either have their own phone or have access to one. A recent report, however, reveals that one in four girls in Australia has been subjected to online grooming, sparking renewed concern about internet safety: boys are about one in eight. Online grooming involves predators using social media, gaming platforms, or other digital channels to build trust with minors for exploitative purposes.

This alarming statistic highlights the urgent need for stronger online protections for children. Advocates are calling for stricter regulations, improved reporting mechanisms, and greater accountability from tech companies to address this growing threat. Parents and caregivers are also encouraged to engage in open conversations with their children about online safety, to monitor their digital activities, and to educate them on recognising and reporting inappropriate behaviour. FOOD BASKETS FOR THE NEEDY

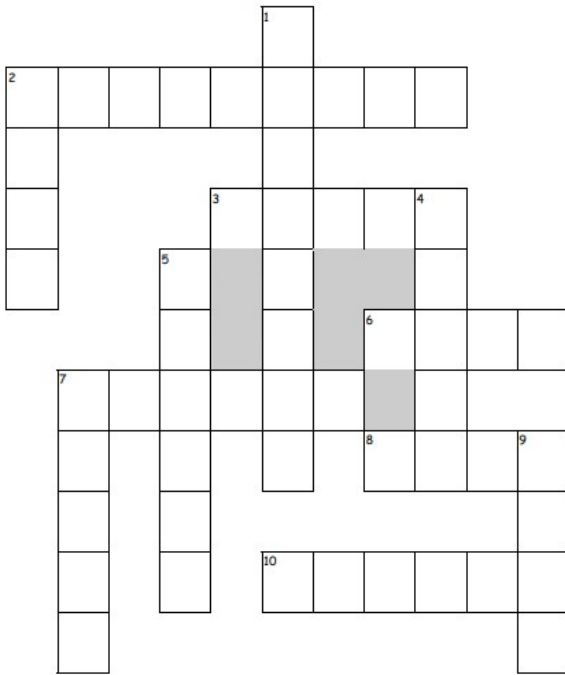

FRANCIS' FOCUS

'God does not want a cruise ship,' Pope Francis quips while reflecting on today's Gospel passage. Instead, as he points out, when the fishermen are tired and dejected Jesus climbs into their boat with them. Moreover, in doing so, Jesus encourages them to go out again for what turns out to be a greater purpose. Their lives are changed when they let Jesus in the boat.

The Pope reminds us that Our Lord can 'make use of our poverty to proclaim his richness, of our miseries to proclaim his mercy.' Provided, that is, we welcome him into our lives and livelihoods.

When we work with God, trusting that Jesus shows us the way, then we will find our true calling. We might even gain the courage to leave our familiar boat behind!

What is crucial, the Pope asserts, is that we 'set out anew with him and to sail a new sea,' open to surprises along the way. When we serve Jesus, the Pope affirms, 'he accomplishes great things in us.' We should therefore heed Jesus' call to each one of us, which is, the Pope suggests, 'to go out into the open sea of the humanity of our time, in order to be witnesses to goodness and mercy.'
