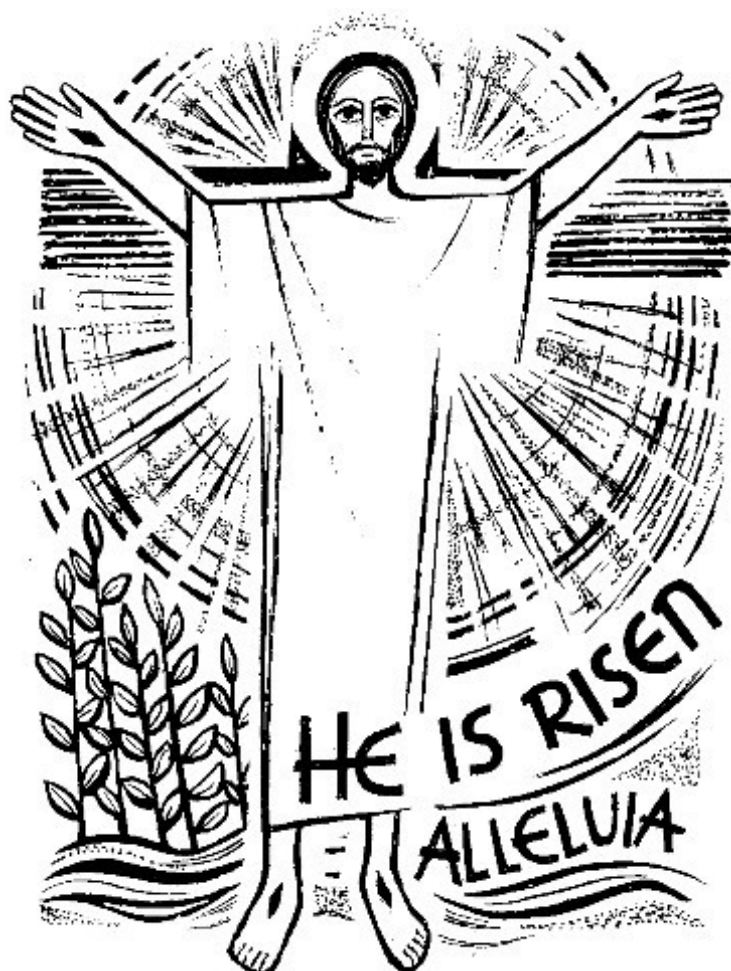

## FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

He is Risen! Alleluia, Alleluia! Happy Easter!

Congratulations to all our Elect and Candidates who are being baptised or received and who are completing their sacraments of initiation. Over the next few weeks, you will get a wonderful opportunity to experience the welcome, celebration, and generosity of this parish community. I know they join with me in joy in saying to you, congratulations, welcome home.

Every part of the Easter Ceremonies has that sense of coming and being home. In medieval times, through to the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> Centuries in many countries as sailors set out to sea, their families would light a lantern each night and place it in the front window of the house. A light to guide their loved one home. Christ is our light, sitting in the front window of our 'house,' guiding the traveller, the explorer, the lost, the family member to the safety and sanctuary of home! Just like the sailor's family we pray as we keep that light protected that those that are lost or at 'sea' will find their way home.

And we sing at the Vigil, as the Paschal candle lit from the Easter fire is carried into the darkened church, to remind ourselves and to declare our lantern alight *'Christ Our Light, Thanks be to God!'*

In our community we have many who are a long way from their ancestral home. Some of course by the choice of migration, some forced as refugees, some due to work. Some of us are estranged from loved ones, some by some fault or failure, some through the actions of another, some by circumstance. Some of us may not celebrate Easter with our family as we work in essential and sometimes non-essential services but all making sure food and shelter are there for the family. For families estranged or away from children and grandchildren it can be a tough time. If you are not with your own family, it can be a sad time even amid Easter joy. Tread softly today and be gentle on yourself and others.

Easter looks different in different countries and cultures. I look forward to sharing some of the variety of difference we have over the years we journey together through the various seasons. Our own culture and way of doing things can give great comfort in the seasons such as Easter, especially when away from family. Sharing with friends and neighbours is a wonderful way of bringing joy to the Easter season.

I pray that regardless of how you celebrate, in joy or



sadness, with or without family, with friends or work mates or on your own, that you know we are your family too, here and for each other. The 'Light' is always in the front room of this house, and you are always welcome.

He is Risen! Alleluia, Alleluia! Happy Easter!

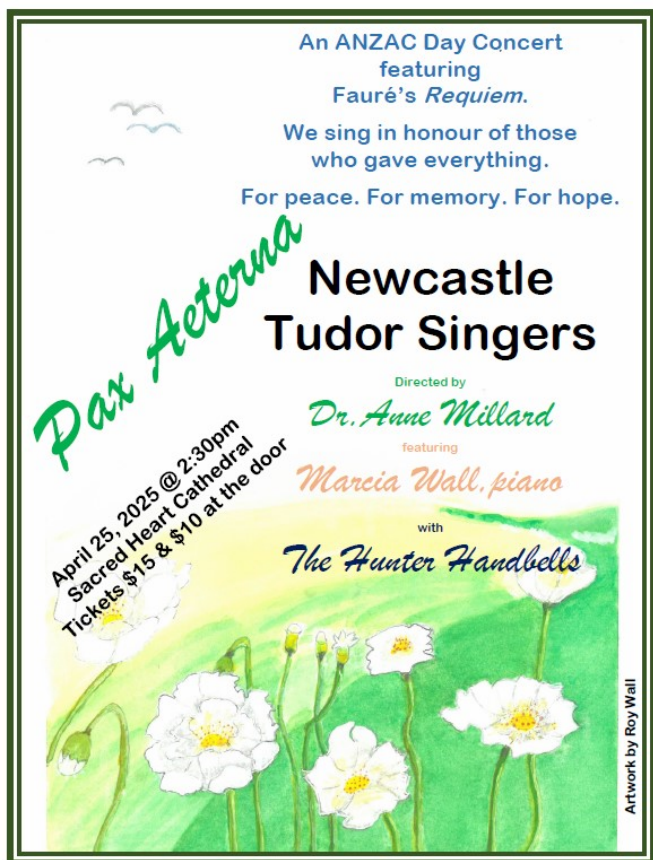
## ANZAC DAY

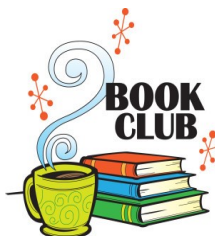

## SAFEGUARDING NEWS

This week, your attention is drawn to the **role of Australian Catholic Safeguarding Ltd (ACSL)**. ACSL has been created to promote and oversee a nationally consistent, comprehensive and sustainable framework for the protection of children and at-risk adults within the Church in Australia. The ACSL has zero tolerance of abuse and works to ensure a safe Church for all.

The findings of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse place responsibility on the Catholic Church to demonstrate greater respect, care and protection for everyone who places their trust in the Church and to comply with legislative obligations in safeguarding and professional standards.

ACSL develops integrated safeguarding services to promote safe environments for children and vulnerable adults, including:

- providing advice to Church Authorities about their safeguarding responsibilities
- providing tailored education and professional development programs
- training of Professional Standards and Safeguarding Officers
- monitoring the implementation of the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards
- managing databases related to Church safeguarding
- overseeing the management of complaints against Church Authorities
- providing independent audit and review certification of safeguarding programs

## FROM POPE FRANCIS

"Dear brothers and sisters, let us not be closed to the newness that God wants to bring into our lives! Are we often weary, disheartened and sad? Do we feel weighed down by our sins? Do we think that we won't be able to cope? 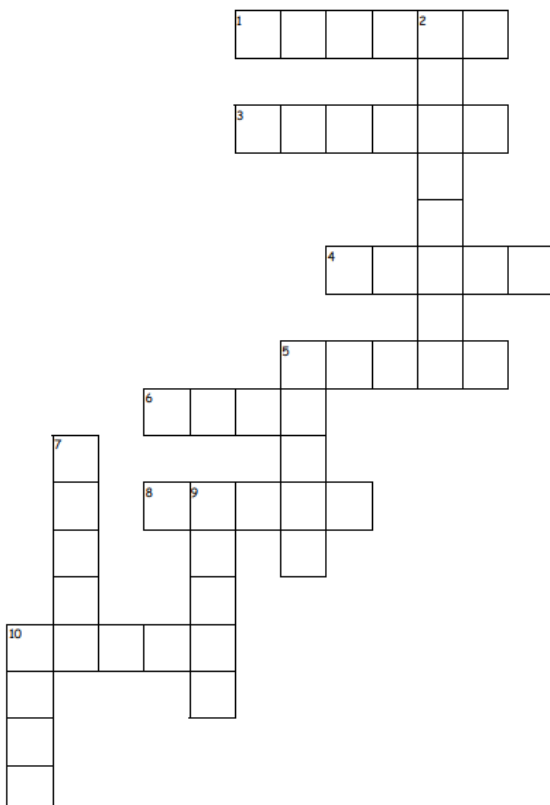

## REFLECTION BY FR MICHAEL TATE

### Dawn has Broken – The Son is Risen

Women go to the tomb as dawn is breaking. The Power of Darkness which had Jesus unjustly sentenced, cruelly tortured and buried in the pitch blackness of the tomb, is conquered by the Son-Rise of all sun rises flooding our world and the whole of human history with Divine Light and Energy.

This is the heart of our faith as Catholic Christians, which we celebrate with bon-fire (good fire) in darkness at the Easter Vigil. From that earthly element we light the Easter candle and the Exsultet is sung: 'Be glad, let earth be glad as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King.'

The resurrection itself is nowhere described in the gospels, but we do have appearances of the Risen Lord Jesus. The first appearance was to a woman, Mary of Magdala. A title given to her by the early church was 'Apostle to the Apostles' because she was the bearer of the message which the male disciples initially did not believe. But eventually they too believed that Death had been done to death because the Son had risen.

Christ's body was transfigured by the energy of Divine Love and we can, by grace, participate in that resurrection life of Our Lord. A glorious destiny awaits us, as indeed it awaits the whole cosmos as it is to be transformed by that resurrection life recreating the whole of creation.

We could take a moment to pray that we, along with all that matters, are graced with the life-giving energy of the Risen Son and that we may join Mary of Magdala in spreading the Good News of Christ's victory over death. Alleluia!

Rev Prof Michael Tate graduated in Law from the University of Tasmania in 1968, and in Theology from Oxford University in 1971. He lectured at the University of Tasmania from 1972-78, being Dean of the Faculty of Law in 1977-78. He was a Senator for Tasmania from 1978-93. He served as Ambassador to The Hague and the Holy See from 1993-96. He then returned to Australia and was ordained in May 2000 and has been a parish priest in the Archdiocese of Hobart since then.
