

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

I haven't had much chance in recent times to sit and watch a game of footy from beginning to end. Last night was an exception as I watched the Carlton Vs Collingwood game — for the uninitiated that is real football, AFL! I enjoyed the game a lot even though neither team is my



team. Go the mighty Hawks. Collingwood walked all over Carlton, and it was as if during the second quarter Carlton gave up. It was interesting. Every team goes through slumps, Carlton's slump seems to be a few more decades longer than most. Their stats are the worst on record for Carlton and the worst in comparison to other teams. The question is 'can they come back'?

I was also able to watch the post-game wash with some of the experts of the game. Their commentary was interesting as they reflected on Carlton's poor attitude, lack of perseverance, diminished confidence, not working as a team, what they do when they get tired, how they face push back, their build and depth physically, are they relying on one member of the team and when he has an off day they can't step up, they have no back up, skill level is poor. Thankfully for a change, the coach is not being blamed, they are recognising that he still has a part to play in the solution. The experts all highlighted all the aspects of a functioning team and questioned all of them as not being in Carlton.

Lent is a great opportunity for us to reflect on our part and our 'team'. In recent times, justly no doubt, the wider community and the media have questioned some of our abilities and values very publicly. In some cases, some of us have been found wanting. Many of us, most of us even have done our bit with great integrity. There have been gaps. It is hard to read as a church and as an individual member of the 'team'.

Let's think about what makes a church team great: formation (reading the scriptures, attending retreats opportunities for engagement with faith education), training (conversations with like minded but not always same minded, testing new ideas and ways of doing, spending time in prayer), knowing the skills team and our (attending functions, conversations after Mass, engaging and meeting new people, learning each other's names, seeing our own talents and gifts), perseverance and confidence (naming the graces and knowing we do good things,

finding ways to change the not so good, picking ourselves up when things don't go our way exactly as we want, lifting others up rather than pulling them down, words of encouragement to self and others), working together (seeing what we can do rather than focussing on what we can't, being presented even when witnessing rather than 'playing', awareness of others and their needs, knowing our gifts and sharing them) invitation and welcome (being open to others who might want to join us, seeing new people and engaging them, making room in our seats and hearts, being brave).

There are other ways of course that all help make our team great. We do good works, and we should be proud enough to want to share that with each other and those we meet along the way.





SAFEGUARDING NEWS

The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of protection within our Parish. This week, your attention is drawn to the **role of the Office of Safeguarding (Oo**S) within all Catholic Church parishes in Australia.

The OoS plays a crucial role in promoting the safety and well-being of children and vulnerable individuals within each parish. It is tasked with ensuring effective protection policies and practices are in place across dioceses and religious organisations. The OoS provides guidance and training to Church personnel on safeguarding protocols, helping to prevent abuse and to ensure a safe environment. It also oversees the response to allegations of abuse, working closely with law enforcement and other relevant authorities to support victims and hold perpetrators accountable.

The OoS also collaborates with other organisations, such as Australian Catholic Safeguarding Ltd, which has been created to oversee a nationally consistent, comprehensive and sustainable framework for the protection of children and adults at risk within the Church in Australia.

Additionally, the OoS supports victims of abuse by providing pastoral care, counselling, and assistance throughout the process of reporting and addressing.

Ultimately, its work reflects the Church's commitment to healing, justice, and the protection of all individuals, especially the most vulnerable.



HOMILY BY RICHARD LEONARD

There is a tough phrase at the end of the Gospel we have just heard; 'Go and sin no more.' It's like a sting in the tail, standing in contrast to the compassion of Jesus in his encounter with the woman. Yet, on closer inspection, it is the most important phrase in the story. And that's saying something because this dramatic event is the only one in the Gospel where Jesus confronts sexual sin, where only the woman is dragged from the scene of the crime to answer the charge of adultery. Is it any wonder that in some early manuscripts of John's Gospel this story was left out, its authorship questioned? The dangerous memory of Jesus' compassion toward the woman was too strong in the minds of John's community for it to be excluded, however, and so it remains as an inspired text for us to make our own. It is sometimes very important to hear Jesus say to us, especially in the area of our sexuality, 'I do not condemn you.'

So often, however, we want Jesus to leave it at that. But Jesus goes further. He tells it as it is. If any of us want life and want it to the full, we have to stop doing the destructive things that get us into trouble in the first place. It does not matter if it is drinking, gambling, eating, working, stealing, sexual dysfunction, being into pornography, being violent at home or any other type of obsessive compulsive behaviour, there is little point in being sorry for the consequences of our weaknesses and not changing the pattern of behaviour that leads us to ruin each time...

...Jesus bestows great dignity on the woman by saving her from being condemned to death, but even more so he knows that it does not have to be like this and so challenges her to turn her life around.

May we hear the same challenge in this final week of Lent. No matter what we have ever done, sexually or otherwise, we are greater than our worst moments. Jesus loves us enough not to condemn us, but to give us this Eucharist so that we might find the strength and hope to stop doing the things that destroy us and to live a life that leads to peace and joy.
