

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

Almost every child who enrolled in our Confirmation process has been Confirmed. We celebrated three lovely liturgies with our Bishop. The feedback I have received shows that



they were truly joy filled moments in the lives not only of those being confirmed but also their families. So much goodwill too amongst families who completed to this step what they promised when their precious child was baptised. Part of fulfilling that promise was of course educating, guiding and modelling faith. I get very excited when families as part of that promise enrol their children in our Catholic schools.

I often remind parents of their promise as well as reminding them that it does take a village to raise a child; they need us as we need them. In the first instance they choose godparents, adults selected from amongst their family and friends, who share the values of their home, have the skills, character, emotional qualities, and right sense that they want for their child. The godparent helps in what we believe makes a life happy and successful. It is not all about the career they will have, rather about the footprints they leave and the way that they leave this world better for their presence. Godparenting is important.

The 'village' is equally important. I believe we all must decide which village we want these young people supported in, which village we would want our own children and grandchildren to be raised as part of. I can list the hundreds of villages that these children will be asked to be part of, and they may or may not include faith. It is not necessarily an 'either or' situation. We don't ask them if they choose our village not to be part of the world: we want them to take our 'vision for' and our 'mission in' out to the world. The other villages (soccer club, netball, art classes etc.) they might choose won't encourage them to our village, especially on a Sunday. Those clubs are full of good people, us in fact – we need to be more overt in our decision making and invitations.

You'll hear me say this a lot over the years I will be your Parish Priest: we get so few opportunities sometimes to engage, support and invite our young people to the table, we must take as many of them as we are able. Come to Confirmation, rejoice at their First Eucharists, and if you can stick around for their baptisms joining in the antiphon 'in Him you have been baptised alleluia, alleluia!' I just believe that in the long run it will bear fruit, fruit that will last.

If you are still reading, I wish to announce too that we

are going to have a **Parish Assembly beginning on November 1 2025,** the details of which are still being worked out, but **planning has begun**. The **where** is still on the table, and whether we have one day or work our way through Advent is still to be discussed. Hopefully there is so much to be decided it might take a day or two. However now is the time for you to **firstly** plan to attend, **secondly** to pray about your hopes and inspirations are for our parishes and **thirdly** think about the topics you would like then discussed. Part of an Assembly is a time for looking back, reflecting on the present and planning for tomorrow. *Start praying and thinking now*.

NOTICE TO PLANNED GIVERS

Parishioners who require a tax receipt for Planned Giving for the 2024/2025 financial year must notify the Parish Office **by Monday, 30 June 2025.** Please submit requests in writing by one of the following methods:



- Email to newcparish@mn.catholic.org.au: Use the wording, "Please provide me with a Planned Giving tax receipt" and include your name and envelope number. OR:
- **Planned Giving Envelope**: Write on your weekly envelope, "Tax receipt required".

Tax receipt data will be processed immediately following 30 June 2025. If you make a request after that date, you will not be eligible for a receipt nor a tax deduction in relation to your Planned Giving contributions. This is because there is a designated sum that can be attributed to Planned Giving receipts and, once this distribution has occurred, no further allocations are possible.

The 'designated sum' provision also means that the claimable amount for each giver decreases when more people request a receipt. We therefore ask that if you do not intend to claim a tax deduction, please do not request a receipt.

The owner of 54A Perkins St, The Hill (the neighbouring property on the southern side of the church) has sought permission from the parish

to assemble scaffolding for the purpose of replacing his roof. The work will impact the garden bed on the shared boundary between the church and the neighbouring property, but will only be done on weekdays and will not affect scheduled church services. Weather permitting, the scaffolding will be assembled over three days (Wednesday, 4 June to Friday, 6 June) and is likely to remain in place for a period of four weeks. The neighbour has provided assurances that he will install temporary fencing to maintain security from public access and that all impacted areas will be returned to 'pre-scaffold condition' after disassembly. We trust this will not cause any inconvenience, but please contact the parish office if you have any questions or concerns.

PROMOTING SAFEGUARDING

The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of protection within our Parish. In view of our current diocesan flooding, we mention **supporting young people during the recovery phase following a**



natural disaster. They may be suffering from losses which are:

- Direct loss of possessions, loss of sense of safety, death of loved ones or pets/animals.
- Indirect through stories of family and friends affected, and children's increased likelihood viewing of graphic content – particularly via social media.


The following tips are helpful in the initial days and weeks following a natural disaster:

- Discuss the importance for young peoples' need to focus on physical and emotional safety
- Support young people to engage in activities that promote a sense of calmness
- Supporting young people to return to some routine and to get back to doing what they used to do as much as possible (e.g. school, games, sports, hobbies)
- Support connection with others, especially those that help young people feel OK
- Include young people in the repair and recovery of their community and support them to identify ways that they can safely connect with themselves, peers, and families in ways that are meaningful and purposeful to them
- Limit exposure to traumatic information through stories and media (social and traditional).

Reflection by Richard Leonard

A teacher told me recently that when she asked her grade fours to draw a picture of the Ascension, not unsurprisingly most of them did a fairly conventional portrait of Jesus rising up on a cloud. One of her students, David, who is a particularly gifted artist, had Jesus blasting off into the sky. Down the side of Jesus' pure white garment was the word NASA and David provided all the sound effects for how he imagined the scene of the first Ascension. He concluded, without a hint of irony, that, 'the Ascension must have been a real blast!'

None of us can blame David for marrying our modern culture with an ancient story. In fact if some of us are honest, David's 'space shuttle Jesus' is not far from what we think as well.

The Ascension stories, however, are not primarily interested in how or when Jesus got back to heaven. John and Paul never mention it at all. Mark and Matthew have it happening on the same day as the Resurrection and Luke has it occurring 40 days after Easter on the same day as Pentecost. The one thing, on which all the New Testament writers agree, is where in heaven Jesus went and where he is presently – at God's right hand.

Even to this day, being on someone's right is a place of honour. In the Old Testament being on the right hand of David, Samuel or Elijah was to be the anointed and favoured one, the true son or daughter. In telling us, then, that Jesus is now at God's right hand, the Gospels use a formal phrase to announce that God affirms everything Jesus said and did on earth and that he is the way for us to follow.

That can be all well and good, but Jesus goes one step further and that's why this feast is so important. Jesus taught us that where he is, so shall we be, that he was going to prepare a place for us and that, in and through him, we will have life and have it to the full.

The feast of the Ascension is the day, each year, where we remember and we celebrate that, just as Jesus was welcomed to God's right hand, so, too, shall we be welcomed to the right hand of Jesus. This is his promise, this is our faith and this is the hope we are called to proclaim to the world. And let's be clear about the invitation. There is nothing we have ever done, are doing, or will do, that will get our name removed from the invitation list to the feast of Christ's kingdom. The challenge is accepting that we have a standing invitation and living lives worthy of the love that places our name on the list. The feast of the Ascension announces that Jesus will faithfully accompany us no matter how far we lose our way and that by our fidelity to Christ we accept or reject the standing offer.

And because the Ascension is an Easter feast it develops even further that there is nowhere, bar evil, where God does not dwell. Because of the Resurrection and Ascension we can find God everywhere we want to: in our homes, our work, our suffering, our old age, our emotional, sexual or financial turmoil – and even in our death.
