FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

I can hardly imagine what it has been like for all those people in the Upper Manning, Taree, Raymond Terrace and Gillieston Heights and further north to Port Macquarie, Kempsey and Coffs Harbour as this weather pattern wreaks havoc. The suddenness of the changing conditions has caught us all off guard. I saw one quite elderly lady wading from her house with just two thin blue plastic bags holding little more than her medications and other precious items. Even with the little she carried she had to leave almost all behind, no room in the rescue boat. How could anyone know that this weather and its flooding would be a 'once-in-a-500 year' event or with the impact and devastation now created.

I have marvelled at the skill of the SES and emergency responders hovering helicopters steady over the stranded, as they were winched to safety. My time in the Air Force gave me a small taste of what it takes to do that – it is impressive, dangerous but impressive. Every news feed has someone from amongst the first responders being heroic saving lives. It is the 'first line' that takes the most risks. I am aware that for every first responder there is a swag of volunteers in other circumstances stepping up to help. I know too that behind them are partners, parents, children who also pay a price for the service they give our community in the most confronting, challenging and dangerous times. They send them off with a generous spirit as they go to help.

We all remember the harrowing times in Lismore with the same weather event and the fallout for lives still trying to get back to a sense of normal. The difficulty of the rebuild and how that is funded is still being worked out. Whole streets have been bought by the government and then boarded up. Homeless have occupied these properties – cleaned them up and moved in. I wonder as this weather heads in that direction what will become of them. A prayer wouldn't hurt for them too.

Many of these 'residents' have been homeless for some time. The government had plans to evict them in the coming days – the weather might just beat them to it. The people interviewed didn't fit any of what I would suggest is often thought of as the homeless stereotype – they have jobs, cars, and personal items, just no legitimate housing available to them. Homelessness is not a lifestyle choice, nor is it generated by drugs and alcohol necessarily. It can be a



factor in relationship break up sometimes and there are those who lose everything because of it. Domestic violence can be a factor in homelessness. There is a chronic housing shortage, options are limited. It is sad to think it is safer on the street than at home.

I feel for all those who are being affected in the northern regions – we need right now to pray. There will be opportunity for all of us to respond in other ways and to share our gifts in the days ahead. May our hearts be open when that call comes. Join me this weekend in prayerful solidarity for those who right now need it most.

HISTORICAL CONTEXT

The time of absence

At the time of writing of the Gospel of John (during the last decade of the 1st Century), the community of believers were beginning to come to terms with the continued absence of Jesus. In the earlier gospels, particularly Mark, there is a feeling of expectation evident in the writing - an expectation that Jesus' promised return was imminent. By the time of John's community, there was an acceptance that the glorious return of Jesus still lay some time in the future. They wrestled with keeping alive the memory and message of Jesus when there was no end in sight.

NOTICE TO PLANNED GIVERS - THE END OF THE FINANCIAL YEAR IS APPROACHING!

Parishioners who require a tax receipt for Planned Giving for the 2024/2025 financial year must notify the Parish Office **by Monday, 30 June 2025**. Please submit requests in writing by one of the following methods:

- **Email to newcparish@mn.catholic.org.au:** Use the wording, *"Please provide me with a Planned Giving tax receipt"* and include your name and envelope number. **OR:**
- **Planned Giving Envelope:** Write on your weekly envelope, *"Tax receipt required"*.

Tax receipt data will be processed immediately following 30 June 2025. If you make a request after that date, you will not be eligible for a receipt nor a tax deduction in relation to your Planned Giving contributions. This is because there is a designated sum that can be attributed to Planned Giving receipts and, once this distribution has occurred, no further allocations are possible.

The 'designated sum' provision also means that the claimable amount for each giver decreases when more people request a receipt. We therefore ask that if you do not intend to claim a tax deduction, please do not request a receipt.

PROMOTING SAFEGUARDING

The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of protection within our Parish. This week, we re-visit safeguarding the rights of women.

Women have historically been excluded from large parts of public and political life in Australian society. In 1850, men in general could vote – women not until 1902 and First Nations women (and men) until 1962. Women were not elected to the Commonwealth Parliament until 1943. Not until 1965 could Australian women drink in a public bar. Up until 1966, women working in the public service (and some other businesses) were required to resign when they got married. While we've come a long way in the last 100 years, there are still many areas in Australian society in which women and girls are still not safeguarded – two examples are given below.

Finance: On average, women are paid 17.5% less than men doing the same work - women work an extra 64 days a year to get the same pay as men doing the same work.

Violence: One in three women will experience physical violence in an intimate relationship, and one in five women have experienced sexual violence since the age of 15. Additionally, domestic violence is the biggest cause of homelessness for Australian women.

REFLECTION BY RICHARD LEONARD

In today's Gospel, Jesus says that as a result of our love for him and fidelity to his word, the Father will come and make a home with us. The image of God as homemaker is not very developed in Christian spirituality. But this is an image that holds a lot for how and where we meet God.

The best homes are places where we relax because we are ourselves, we are known and we know the others with whom we live. There is something intimate and familiar about our home that enables us to relax on many levels as we turn the key. Home is an earthy place where we don't get away with much and our vulnerability can be on display. Christian homes are particularly hospitable places, where Christ dwells in them to the degree that dignity, love and forgiveness are present.

A home, however, is more than a house in which people live. Homes need work and attention. A friend of mine says memories rarely just happen, they need to be created. That's the sort of attention to a family's life that turns a house into a home.

And this is the world in which God enters our lives. God wants us to be relaxed and vulnerable in God's presence. We don't need to put on a show or say what we think God wants to hear, that's a theatre where we preform, not a home where we know each other. Easter faith is about being comfortable and intimate, about being who we are, rather than the persona we would prefer God to see.

As with most of our homes, being at home with God has its ups and downs, days when we think we cannot bear to stay one more moment, other days where we could never imagine being anywhere else and then most days where we are neither up nor down and we just get on with the routine of our lives. God the homemaker remains faithful through it all, offering the gift of Easter peace, sending us out to proclaim Christ's Kingdom, welcoming us home eager to learn how everything went and reassuring us always that while God is at home with us our hearts should never be troubled and we are not to be afraid.

For Christians, nostalgia is not about living in the past, it is about yearning for the sort of home where our heart truly is.
